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Introduction

A Christian struggling with financial problems is experiencing a direct result of their lack of knowledge concerning the financial inheritance they have in Christ. Money problems disappear when believers understand the purpose of God giving them the power to establish wealth. As sons and daughters of God, we are called to labor in our Father's vineyard and mature to the point where we fulfill our specific assignment in His Kingdom. Once we mature and align with God's plan and path for our lives, He empowers us to prosper.

Moving Beyond Selfish Prosperity

Alrighty, let us get right to the heart of what God is doing in this hour. For years, prosperity teaching has been focused strictly on the personal side of things, getting people to believe that God meets their personal needs.

Now, God certainly meets our personal needs, but we are entering a season where we must move into a deeper dimension of this truth. We have to move past a carnal, fleshly understanding and step into a spiritual understanding of who we are as sons and daughters of God on the earth. God created every single one of us for a specific reason and a divine purpose that He desires to use us to fulfill His plans for humanity earth through us.

Ephesians 2:10 AMP

For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we

would walk in them [living the good life which He prearranged and made ready for us].

God has already prepared a path and made a work ready for us before the world was ever founded. The problem is that most people do not have a mind to expand the Kingdom of God. Jesus is the King of kings and Lord of lords, having all authority in heaven, on earth, and under the earth. He is the inheritor of the earth, and we are joint-heirs with Him.

Romans 8:16-17

The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together.

As mature sons and daughters, we have a specific assignment given to us by God. Too often, believers have worked and sought material things solely for themselves without ever shifting to a Kingdom mindset where they allow God to use them to expand His territory. When you get a Kingdom mindset, God puts you in places you might not naturally qualify for or have the natural background to hold.

The Assignment in the Vineyard

He transfers wealth because we are the just. We have been made righteous in the eyes of God through our faith in Jesus Christ, but we must mature to qualify for the fullness of our spiritual inheritance. Our spiritual inheritance is tied directly to our job assignment, our purpose, and God's plan for our lives.

Proverbs 13:22

A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children, but the wealth of the sinner is stored up for the righteous.

Proverbs 29:2

When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice; but when a wicked man rules, the people groan.

If someone is a schoolteacher, they are not sitting in that classroom just to earn a paycheck. They are there on an assignment from God to pray, intercede, and stand in the gap for the children who walk through that door.

Take a nurse's aide for instance. Everyone around them might be encouraging them to go back to school to become a nurse so they can make more money. But a person who truly understands their assignment, their heart, and the specific gift God has given them will not chase after a title or extra money just for the sake of cash. My wife was a nurse's aide, and her heart was purely to serve the people right there in that role. She never had a desire to become a nurse, even though she could have made more money, because she stated clearly that her assignment was to be a nurse's aide. That was her call, that was her gift, and she stayed within that grace. We must know what we are truly called to do and remain within our assigned gift. It is right there within your divine gift—not in chasing money or material resources—that God guarantees all your needs are met in overflowing abundance.

Every job you hold is a mission field. When I worked for the telecommunications company, going into people's homes to service phones and cable, I was not just getting money for myself. God made sure my personal needs were met because I was laboring in my Father's vineyard. I was praying for those people, interceding for them, and helping them right where they were.

We cannot limit ministry to what happens behind a pulpit. Every born-again believer has a Kingdom job assignment ordained by God before the foundation of the world. Worldly people seek money, wealth, status, and accolades strictly for personal gain and self-aggrandizement. They are not trying to expand the Kingdom of God. But God wants to mature us as His sons and daughters so He can release His power to us to obtain wealth, allowing us to step into places of authority and rule on His behalf.

Deuteronomy 8:18

And you shall remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you power to get wealth, that He may establish His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day.

We do not use wealth to suppress or control people. We use the wealth God gives us to bless people, build them up, and pull them out of the tough, oppressive situations the enemy has constructed in this world.

Maturing to Receive the Inheritance

You cannot receive your inheritance until you grow up and understand its true purpose. The purpose of your inheritance is not to hoard it or consume it upon your own lusts. It is being empowered by God to establish His covenant in the earth. God will promote you and place you in positions of oversight, giving you what I call "God jobs." Someone else may currently be sitting in your seat, managing the people you were ordained to manage, or living in the area you were called to impact. God wants to promote you so that you can oversee and manage those resources on His behalf.

Colossians 3:23-24

And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ.

2 Corinthians 5:15

and He died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again.

We have to lay down our own selfish agendas, let Christ live through us, and do everything as unto Him.

Heart Alignment and Kingdom Motives

In Matthew chapter six, Jesus laid out the core principles of the Kingdom regarding our treasure and our motives.

Matthew 6:19-21

Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

God's primary treasure on this earth is people. Souls are the heart of God. It is His absolute will that all men be saved, delivered, healed, and set free from the power of the enemy. As we mature as children of God, we uncover the Father's heart and align ourselves with His will. He has endowed us with gifts, talents, and abilities to serve humanity for His glory.

Matthew 6:24

No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one or love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

Jesus makes it clear that our heart motive behind why we do what we do in the financial arena must be pure. We serve God right in our workplaces by letting our light shine so brightly that people are drawn to Jesus. When we carry ourselves with godly character, people bring their life problems to us, opening the door for us to share Christ and point them to salvation.

Matthew 6:25-26

Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow

nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

God has already built provision into creation for the birds of the air. When we learn to live from the Kingdom within, all our physical provision manifests on the outside. Our God opens up the way because we have made a solid commitment to use our gifts, talents, and abilities to expand His Kingdom.

Seeking First the Kingdom

Matthew 6:31-33

Therefore do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?" or "What shall we wear?" For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.

Unbelievers spend their entire lives chasing after material things, but your heavenly Father already knows what you need. When Jesus mentioned Solomon in all his glory, He revealed a profound secret. Solomon did not pray for money or wealth; he prayed for wisdom to lead and care for God's people. Because Solomon's heart was set on serving God's purpose, God gave him unprecedented wealth alongside that wisdom.

When a believer matures, their secular job becomes their primary ministry. Needs are met in overflowing abundance because you are walking in your divine assignment. There are no big "I's" or little "you's" in the Kingdom of God. There are simply sons and daughters who embrace where God has ordained them to live, work, and serve.

Romans 8:19

For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God.

The earth is off course, groaning and waiting for mature sons and daughters to step into their inheritance. Money is not the issue. God will always supply the military budget for His own soldiers.

1 Corinthians 9:7

Who ever goes to war at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat of its fruit? Or who tends a flock and does not drink the milk of the flock?

Expanding the Father's Territory

When the purity of your heart is aligned with God's purpose, He supernaturally multiplies your resources. He elevates you into positions of influence so you can direct wealth, power, and authority toward godliness, establishing His Kingdom and eliminating money problems forever.

Consider the Old Testament believer Jabez and how he prayed.

1 Chronicles 4:10

And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!" So God granted him what he requested.

Jabez prayed for God to expand his territory, but we must look at this through a New Testament lens. The scripture declares that the earth is the Lord's and Jesus is the inheritor of all things. We need to ask God to give us a heart to pray for our territory to be expanded, understanding that the territory we are expanding belongs entirely to Jesus, who is the King of the Kingdom. We ask Him to empower us so we can enlarge the footprint of His Kingdom across every sphere of life.

When our heart's intent is to expand Jesus's territory, God touches and corrects our hearts regarding money. He transforms us into faithful

managers of His wealth, fulfilling His covenant to empower us to prosper to build His Kingdom. When your heart is set on expanding the Kingdom of God, He takes care of your heart, handles your resources, and eliminates your financial problems forever.
